87 Swimming Pool Closure

Following discussion on the strong feelings expressed at the Annual Community Meeting by both the community and the St Davids Community Pool Group it was RESOLVED to:-

87.1 Write to the leader of Pembrokeshire County Council Councillor J Davies asking for a public meeting with him together with Cabinet Members Cllr H M George (Responsible for Children, Young People, Learning and Welsh Language), Councillor RM Lewis (Cultural Services, Sports, Leisure and Tourism), Councillor Mark Edwards (Communities and Partnerships) and Councillor D Wildman (Adult Services and Care). The City Council would facilitate the meeting at a time to suit Cllr Davies' availability.

87.1.1 When the meeting date was set the Assembly Member and MP would also be invited.

87.1.2 Clarification on the availability of land that could be used as an alternative site to enable both a pool and sports hall was also to be requested.

87.2 Write to St Davids Community Pool Group with a request for further questions for that meeting.

87.3 Write to Pembrokeshire Coast National Park Authority regarding the planning position on land available.

87.4 Defer any decision regarding the City Council opposing a planning application that involves removing the pool until the receipt of the planning application.

87.5 Write to the Governors of Ysgol Dewi Sant asking for support for the pool in the light of their support of the Sports Hall on the pool site.

87.6 Arrange a meeting of the Mayor, Deputy Mayor and Clerk with Chairs of neighbouring community councils and county councillors.

Councillor J Braby declared as a member of the St Davids Community Pool User's Group regarding minute 92.

91 Co-option of a new member of Council

At 6.30pm Mr W Morris joined the meeting and a discussion was held on his interest in becoming a councillor. Mr Morris then left the meeting at 6.40pm.

Similarly at 6.40pm Mrs P Goddard met with the council and discussed her request to be considered to be a city councillor. Mrs Goddard then left the meeting at 6.55pm.

91.1 A late verbal request from Mr A Francis was received by the Clerk on 18 May at 3.45pm. As this was past the closure date of 4 May it was RESOLVED not to be considered but Mr Francis was to be thanked for his interest in the position.

On a ballot the votes cast were:-

91.2 Mr W H Morris 3 votes

91.3 Mrs P A Goddard 8 votes

91.3.1 It was then RESOLVED that Mrs P Goddard be co-opted as a City Councillor.

Matters arising from the Minutes:**92 Pool and Sports Hall at Ysgol Dewi Sant site.**

The Mayor gave a detailed report on efforts made during the preceding week to retain the pool including a meeting with the neighbouring council representatives.

An email version of a letter from Mr J Davies, Leader of Pembrokeshire County Council of 18 May 2009 was circulated advising that Mr Davies would not attend a public meeting together with a clear statement regarding the decision to close the pool.

The legality of the possible demolition of the pool without a clear view from the planning authority was still felt to be unclear and the response of Pembrokeshire Coast National Park Authority on this was awaited following from the City Council's letter of 15 May 2009.

Ways of challenging through the use of planning law and through the Ombudsman were discussed as members were supportive of these routes but also noted that the outcome of this may not effect the position and could cause major delay.

The continuation of the wind turbine generated mixed feelings as there was a need to consider other energy systems as well, it being noted that this aspect of the scheme was being taken forward by the Eco City Group.

D Chant noted that a show of hands at the annual meeting over support for the wind turbine lacked clarity as while formally the meeting had finished, there was a show of hands in support of a request from Mr D Rowlands and not the Chair.

Regarding the availability of the pool and a sports hall, Cllr M Gray as land owner emphasised that his family did not want payment for the land other than for the legal costs to be covered and he emphasised he had only been contacted once by Mr Mark Lewis.

- 92.1 There was a lack of clarity regarding the timetable for a complaint going to the Ombudsman and it was RESOLVED to support the Community Pool Group in principle over its complaint to the Ombudsman over lack of consultation
- 92.2 J Braby presented a Community Pool Group request for a commitment from the City Council not to support a planning application for the provision of a Sports Hall at the school site if it was located on the actual site of the pool.
It was RESOLVED that the City Council fully supports all activities to retain the use of the pool but cannot comment on a planning application that is not before them with Cllr C Taylor emphasising that he did not support this proposal.

- 92.7 The Mayor had a short meeting with Mr M Lewis of Pembrokeshire County Council on 15 May 2009 by way of introduction as the new mayor but no new information was presented.

Minutes of a Special Meeting of Council on the Proposed Swimming Pool Closure on Wednesday 27th May 2009 in the Council Chamber at 3.00pm.

Present: SJ Halse Mayor, JG Lloyd Deputy-Mayor, JW Braby, DJO Chant, PA Goddard, MC Gray, MGD James, JG Lloyd, CT Taylor with DC Menday (Clerk).

The Mayor welcomed Councillor Mrs Pat Goddard to her first meeting and also Mrs S Preece as Secretary of St.Davids Community Pool Group.

128 Apologies for Absence: J George, B Price, R Thornton, S Williams and P Evans.
Deirdre Connell - Chair of St.Davids Community Pool Group.

129 Pool and Sports Hall:

The Mayor reviewed the current position noting that:-

- The Leader of Pembrokeshire County Council's letter and decision not to attend a public meeting at the City Council's request and its lack of comment about alternative approaches to retaining a pool had been received. The Leader noted that pools were services that are not a part of the County Council's statutory responsibilities and many authorities in Wales are closing pools. As St.Davids is being offered something rather than nothing it implied it is a good deal as there is no requirement to provide a sports hall.
- A request for written assurance that the pool will not be demolished until planning approval has been granted has not received a response.
- Pembrokeshire County Council has announced that the pool will close on Sunday 7 June.
- D Connell (Community Pool Group) and J Davies (Chair of Solva Community Council) visited the Clerk following the closure announcement and this meeting was called as a result. Ways of challenging this decision via planning law and /or complaints directly to Pembrokeshire County Council and the Ombudsman have been considered particularly by St Davids Community Pool Group and Solva Community Council the latter receiving no consultation in comparison with St Davids.
- Pembrokeshire Coast National Park Authority responded last week giving the position regarding policy 124 that assists protection of community facilities and a comment over the provision of access to the site through a new road off Glasfryn Road was indicated. It also noted that the Authority needed to consider the situation should demolition occur prior to a planning application being submitted. No planning application for a sports hall had been received to date.
- Looking at the criteria used by the Ombudsman in handling complaints, it particularly looks to see if people are affected unfairly while also noting that there can be no complaint if unpopular or difficult decisions are made, but it will investigate decisions not made properly.

The Pool Group's draft complaint highlights a lack of interaction between Pembrokeshire County Council and different groups in the community with a detailed chronology being provided.

The Mayor while acknowledging there are grounds for complaint, asked how will it take swimming pool and sports hall provision forward as the Ombudsman's deliberations take some months and even if successful there would only be a nominal fine or censure on the County Council.

The possibility of delay could jeopardise the sports hall as a result. C Taylor noted that land was already available for the sports hall.

Points noted from the ensuing discussion included:

D Chant - Pembrokeshire County Council are proposing closure not demolishing the pool but the money saved will fund the sports hall in their plans, it being noted that the sports hall can be built next to, not on the pool site.

J Braby - Need to address the urgent and specific problem of closure of the pool.

S Preece then reviewed the Pool Group's position.

1. A formal complaint is virtually finished and will be delivered in the next 2 days with it being sent to the Ombudsman and to the Chief Executive of Pembrokeshire County Council. They are also asking Pembrokeshire County Council to hold the decision to close the pool.
2. This could allow Pembrokeshire County Council to stop the Sports Hall but it was felt a negative response, doing nothing was more likely. The group also made suggestions for a constructive way forward with an alternative scheme and proposals.
3. The St Davids Community Pool Group wishes to use their complaint as a press release and the Ombudsman's view on whether this is allowed will be sought.

D Chant - is there a date for demolition? No information was available.

S Preece understood that the Pembrokeshire Coast National Park Authority has concerns over planning and is believed to be liaising with Pembrokeshire County Council on this matter.

Discussion followed on funding and legal options in terms of both challenge to the closure threat as well as future options.

The prospect of demolition or closure without planning permission made no sense.

G James noted the need to consider Pembrokeshire Coast National Park Authority's preference for access via Glasfryn Road. This could be revisited as a part of a new scheme.

The assurance that Mr M Lewis of Pembrokeshire County Council gave that closure would not occur until a contract was due to start was restated.

Access to Sports Facilities – S Preece wrote to Mr M Lewis re scale and opening hours of the new facilities and reported that M Lewis stated it will be available at all times with public use around the school programme.

D Chant had previously asked J George why was this not challenged earlier and J George had indicated to him that there was an intention to close all pools in Pembrokeshire apart from Haverfordwest and Fishguard.

C Taylor asked if there were any other members or officers of Pembrokeshire County Council who could be part of the complaint whereas J Braby was concerned about making the complaint too personal.

D Chant had concerns about the management standards of the pool slipping in recent times.

G James felt a new substantial project is required with a new business plan.

C Taylor – asked is there a case for complaint against our own County Councillor?
This was not accepted by the meeting.

S Preece reported that Cllr J Davies, Chair of Solva Community Council had met Cllr Mark Edwards, Cabinet Member for complaints as well as Community and Partnerships. She also had not received any documents as requested from the County Council and she suggested that there was never a feasibility study and the only consultation was through the visits to St. Davids City Council and the Governors of Ysgol Dewi Sant.

The complaints campaign that the group had started was generating many responses and apparently Pembrokeshire County Council is to treat these complaints simply as objections and this was seen as unacceptable.

School swimming - It was unclear what timetable arrangements were in place for primary schoolchildren.

The points raised were RESOLVED to be considered on Monday 1 June 2009.
